

SHELL GAINS

When it comes to turtles, the hands-down star of the show on Kiawah Island is the loggerhead. For quite some time, the island has proven to be one of this sea turtle's most productive nesting areas on the entire East Coast. But did you know that there is another species in the turtle family that makes Kiawah Island home and whose preservation is also of great interest in the scientific community?

That would be the diamondback terrapin (*Malaclemys terrapin*). This small native of the East Coast can be found from as far north as Massachusetts all the way south to the Florida Keys. The reason it doesn't draw as much popular attention is that it makes its home in brackish water and marshes, which is one explanation for why Kiawah Island's carefully preserved network of tidal creeks and marsh habitat is ideal for these creatures.

Hunted almost to the point of extinction in the early 1900s because of the popularity of turtle soup, the species has since recovered but is still classified as Vulnerable due to reducing population numbers. Happily, Kiawah Island Golf Resort supports the work of the nonprofit Kiawah Island Diamondback Terrapin Project, which for 37 years has been conducting scientific research on the animals, led by Dr. Whit Gibbons.
